"I know firsthand what it's like to have nothing while trying to raise your kids," Big Mama said. Her work came to the attention of John Weaver and Dr. Elizabeth King and they held the first holiday party to benefit Big Mama's Team of Life. They started it all by asking relatives and friends to stop by their home and bring a toy for Big Mama instead of a bottle of wine.

From that homespun beginning the event grew by leaps of faith and bounds of generosity until it became what it is today, a major celebration of all that is good and giving in the people of South Florida.

Sponsors of this year's bash, in addition to the Hilton Fort Lauderdale Beach Resort, are the International Holistic Center, the Women's International Holistic Council and Portside Realty.
